The resort beach will start getting sand in January 2025 and we should see sand on Croatan Beach by July 2025.



<u>Stroke Awareness Month:</u> May is Stroke Awareness Month. Learn and know the signs of a stroke in yourself and others. Google "Stroke Awareness" to learn more and remember **BE FAST**. Strokes are lifethreatening emergencies – **call 9-1-1**.



On-Street Parking in Croatan: Last month I wrote that the seasonal fees for parking in the Croatan parking lot (south end of Vanderbilt) went into effect on April 1. I neglected to address on-street parking in Croatan; so here goes:

The following streets are designated as "No Parking" [at all times]: S. Atlantic Ave, Virginia Dare Dr, Twilight Ln, Croatan Hills Ct, Croatan Hills Dr, Mace Hill St, Aqua Ln, S. Maryland Ct, Lockheed Ave, Kerry Ln, and Surfside and Vanderbilt Avenues south of Croatan Rd.

On-street parking north of Croatan Rd is limited to marked spaces on Surfside and Vanderbilt Avenues between the hours of 9:30 AM and 7:00 PM. <u>Please</u> do not park outside of those times, <u>please</u> do not block mail box access (actually a federal crime), and <u>please</u> allow residents to put out their trash barrels on Mondays (for Tuesday pick-up).

While many see this primarily as a courtesy issue – safety takes precedence when residents are unable to see cross traffic, pedestrians, pets, and bicyclists while exiting their driveways.

Remember – most streets in our lovely beach community lack sidewalks. Please drive slowly on these streets and beware of backing vehicles.

Our safety patrol officers have been asked to enforce parking regulations. When they do so, they will be looking at safety inspection stickers and registrations as well.

Dogs on Croatan Beach: Beginning 10:00 AM Saturday, May 25, dogs **may not be on Croatan Beach** between the hours of 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM. (Legitimately registered/marked service animals are allowed during the restricted hours but <u>must be leashed</u> or in escape-proof containers). Comfort and emotional support animals are **not** included in this exception.

All dogs are allowed <u>leashed or unleashed</u> (if under handler's verbal control) on the beach up until 10:00 AM and after 6:00 PM daily (daylight hours only). Handlers must clean up after their animals. Bag dispensers and trash barrels are available at every beach entrance.

<u>Dogs in Oceanfront Resort Area</u>: Dogs are <u>not allowed</u> on the Resort Area Oceanfront sand beach from Rudee Inlet north to 42nd Street. This is a <u>24/7</u> rule during "the season." The rules for dogs on beaches north of 42nd Street are the same as for Croatan (see above).

<u>Dogs on the Boardwalk</u>: Leashed dogs are allowed on the Oceanfront Boardwalk and grass surfaces west of the boardwalk between the hours of 6:00 AM and 7:00 PM. Again, owners must clean up their pet's waste.

Atlantic Hurricane Season Begins June 1: Take the time to review your Hurricane Preparedness Kit, identify your evacuation zone (Know Your Zone LVDEM (vaemergency.gov)), "favorite" the National Weather Center out of Wakefield, Virginia at https://forecast.weather.gov, and subscribe to VBAlert (More About VBAlert: VBgov.com - City of Virginia Beach) for weather warnings and guidance. All of Croatan is in either Evacuation Zone A, B, or C. Forecasters predict an above average Hurricane Season in 2024. What we

observed last year is that warmer ocean temperatures contribute to building massive (Cat 5) storms very quickly. You must re-register with *VBAlert* <u>at least</u> <u>every six-months</u> to continue receiving severe weather notifications.

25 MPH Speed Limit throughout Croatan: Notwithstanding the removal of a speed table, the speed limit within Croatan remains 25 MPH – slower when conditions warrant (e.g., when pedestrians are present on our non-sidewalked throughfares, at night in fog or rain). Drivers can expect more police speed enforcement as "the season" progresses.

Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC): At the April 10 meeting of the Citizen's Advisory Committee representatives of the VB Public Libraries stated that a moratorium on late return fines, originally implemented for youthful borrowers, has been extended to all library users. The Oceanfront Library (700 VB Blvd [17th Street]) also emplaced small lending libraries in nearly trailer parks and Section 8a housing facilities to encourage reading among youngsters.

All libraries have "loaner kits" for a variety of youth and adult learning and recreational activities. Please visit https://libraries.virginiabeach.gov for more information.

The non-profit **Friends of the Library** (https://www.friendsvblibrary.org has donated more than \$100,000 for book purchases. The libraries also accept "gently-used" books from the public. **Croatan has its own small lending library on Vanderbilt Ave** – feel free to donate or borrow a book. 'Tis the season for a good "beach read."

The influx of seasonal visitors to Virginia Beach also brings with it an influx of opportunists (read: predators). Please continue to remove valuables (especially firearms) from vehicles and lock your vehicles, even if in the garage. April crime statistics already show an increase in motor vehicle thefts in Second Precinct (our catchment area).

National Police Week is May 9 – 18. To show solidarity with police and respect the fallen peace officers, citizens are asked to burn a blue light on their porch or in a window during this week. As I write this, news is reporting that four officers have been killed in Charlotte, NC. VBPD Chief Paul Neudigate recently reported that our officers can expect the presence of a firearm – whether legally-owned and responsibly handled or not - on every response.

May is also **Military Appreciation Month** and culminates in **Memorial Day** – the day the Nation set aside to honor deceased servicemen and women. This year, Memorial Day will be observed on Monday, May 27.

We will Hail & Farewell Captains "Dirty" Harry McBrien and Brad Wesseler at the upcoming CAC meeting, to be held on Wednesday, May 8, 2024 at 7:00 PM in the conference room of Virginia Beach Volunteer Rescue Squad #14, 740 VB Blvd (17th Street). Please park on the east side of the building. CAC meetings are open to all.
