
CROATAN BOOK CLUB

Safety/Security – September, 2024

Residents/Owners: Please share with renters and contractors – <u>be courteous</u>; we <u>all</u> live in this community.

School Zones and Buses: Schools are open. Drivers should adjust their commute to allow increased transit time as well as tune-up their situational awareness to be alert for school buses picking up or discharging students. Please be mindful of speed limit changes in school zones, especially where the zone starts immediately after a turn, such as at S. Birdneck Road.

You *must* stop for buses with red flashing lights; even if traveling in the opposite direction when on roads *without* an island dividing the lanes (e.g., General Booth Boulevard north of Croatan Road).

Plan ahead by departing 10 - 15 minutes earlier than you currently do and drive with patience. Beware of children running to catch the bus and who may be inattentive to traffic.

Seasonal Changes in Croatan:

- <u>Lifeguards</u> are no longer available at Croatan Beach "after the season." To reduce your risk respect the ocean, watch wading children closely, don't enter the water alone or overestimate your swimming ability, know how to drown-proof and how to escape a rip current (see past Croatan Newsletters for illustration).
- **Dogs** are allowed on Croatan Beach all daylight hours after Labor Day. They may run free if under their handler's watchful eye and command. The city stocks plastic bags at every beach entrance please use them or bring your own to <u>pick up after your pooch</u>. Trash barrels are also at every beach access point. The sand can still get hot on sunny days, so be mindful not to let paw pads get burnt.
- <u>Croatan Parking Lot</u> will cease charging parking fees effective Tuesday, October 1, but the city will close the lot earlier 5:00 PM. If locked in, call 3-1-1

<u>Hurricane Season – at least another two months</u>: The Atlantic Hurricane Season officially lasts until November 30. With warming seas, storms could persist beyond that date. Even if we don't suffer a direct hit, storms offshore can generate high surf and life-threatening rip currents, as we experienced with Hurricane Ernesto last month.

Elections: Election Day is Tuesday, November 5, 2024. On this year's ballot are the offices of President and Vice President of the United States, one U. S. Senator from Virginia, all members of the U. S. House of Representatives, a proposed Amendment to the Virginia Constitution, Mayor of Virginia Beach, most City Council Members (including Croatan's District 5 Council Seat), and VB School Board Members. Some key dates:

- Last Day to Register to Vote for the election is Tuesday, October 15.
- **Early In-Person Voting** begins Friday, September 20 and ends Saturday, November 2. Visit https:// voter.virginiabeach.com for full details.
- Absentee Mail-In Ballot applications are available at the aforementioned website. Please note the website's caveats on United States Postal Service lengthened delivery standards and reduced performance. If you're voting by mail <u>mail early</u>!
- Election Signs are individual citizens' expressions of their support for certain issues/ candidates. Respect the First Amendment right of neighbors to harbor differing opinions regarding which candidate/ issue they support. Please resist the urge to defile a neighbor's property or deface, take down, or destroy signs of candidates/issues that differ from your own. This is the self-discipline, respect for the rule of law, and freedom of speech that has made our country great.

<u>Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC)</u>: Held on the second Wednesday of the month at VB Volunteer Rescue Squad #14 (740 VB Blvd, 23451). Next meeting is September 11 and is open to all.

Lock Vehicles and Remove Valuables: VBPD Second Precinct Commander, Captain Brad Wesseler, said that police are observing more window smashing thefts from automobiles of late. Locking your vehicle is no longer enough. Police encourage removal of all valuables or at a minimum, locking them away out of sight. The exception remains <u>firearms – *please* remove them when you leave the vehicle</u>.

Firearm Safety at Home: Several recent incidents remind us to keep firearms locked away and out of children's reach. Kids and adults are being accidently shot (some fatally) by youngsters, <u>some as young as 2-years-old</u>, who access loaded weapons. Parents/guardians who fail to do keep firearms from children are being prosecuted. <u>VBPD offers trigger locks for free</u>.
