

There is no change to the current schedule. The Croatan Beach nourishment fill schedule is May 17 to May 27, 2025. This, of course, could be affected by weather. It should take 11 days.

As previously mentioned, the contract was awarded to Geosyntec Consultants/ATM.

Wes Laine, Bob Lougen, and I attended a meeting with the Geosyntec people and the city engineers on November 24th. It was a "listening session." The dialog back and forth was very open and everyone listened a lot to each other. We learned about other weirs around the country and the challenges of getting them right. Regardless of the final design, we were assured that more sand would accumulate on the Croatan beach. I jokingly suggested that we want to hear people complain that the beach is too wide.

Based on our conversation, I am guessing at the following timeline. Site investigation and analysis: (6 mos.) May-June 2025 Design and permitting: (6 - 12 mos.) Jan – Jun 2026

- The unknown timing is how long to will take to get all the many permits required.

Construction: The latter half of 2026. Realistically, probably completed in early 2027.

Sometime in early 2025, there will be a public presentation from Geosyntec and the city engineers.



Safety/Security - December, 2024

Bottom Line Up Front:

<u>Motor Vehicle Larcenies</u>: Croatan was hit by a string of thieves targeting valuables in motor vehicles in late-November. Home surveillance systems generated some excellent full-facial photos of "suspected" perpetrators. Police reports have been made and I have forwarded those photos that I have received on to the police. It cannot be said enough – <u>ensure that your vehicles are locked</u>. Remove all valuables – <u>especially firearms</u> – from vehicles.

<u>Packages, packages, packages</u>: Our security patrol officers report "a lot of packages observed on porches and sticking out of mailboxes." Since many companies report package delivery via email or text, please be attentive to the notifications and consider asking neighbors if they will pick-up the items for safekeeping while you're away.

I have not heard many "porch-pirate" pilferage reports but given the previous note – know that ne'er-do-wells are out there. Also, *PLEASE*, inform the CCL of any crimes, police responses, or other security/safety-related events in the neighborhood. Hearing of these incidents third hand several days later reduces their utility.

<u>Croatan Security Patrols - Survey:</u> Croatan has employed off-duty VBPD police officers to patrol our neighborhood, monitor speed, and (yes) issue citations (warnings or tickets) for illegally parked vehicles for nearly 30 years. While our security officers have committed to patrolling Croatan during their on-duty hours (when other tasking allows) they are not assigned to us full-time; nor are they available via cellphone for ad hoc requests, as was once the case.

Times have changed and the cost of continuing patrol services has risen to more than \$20,000 per annum despite paring back allotted hours by a third in order to stretch finances.

The CCL is therefore faced with deciding whether to continue to solicit funds to keep these patrols or terminate them and instead rely on available police. CCL VP Bob Lougen has placed the survey on our website (https://croatanbeach.org). Please sign-in on the website and complete the survey no later than December 15.

<u>Croatan Parking Concerns</u>: Despite the intersession of Deputy Mayor and District 5 Councilwoman Rosemary Wilson, **City Manager Patrick Duhaney** provided an incomplete, perfunctory, and overall unfavorable response to Croatan's request to pass an ordinance outlawing parking in front of mailboxes, etc.

Fortunately, Croatan residents refuse to accept bureaucratic patronization and have continued to document abusive parking. These emails and photos (such as the attached) have elicited secondary "eye-opening" responses from the City Manager's Special Assistant Mr. Mattes and Ms. Wilson; both of whom realize that there's "meat on this bone." Please continue to document parking abuses. Key email addresses are:

Be respectful, unemotional, and focused on issues where the whole neighborhood can benefit, such as:

- a) Passing a City Ordinance making it a ticketing offense for parked vehicles to block mailboxes;
- Re-measuring parking spaces on Surfside and Vanderbilt to eliminate those that no longer accommodate vehicles that have grown in length, breadth, and height since the spaces were originally approved and laid out in 2004 (see great exemplar in adjacent photo); and
- Modifying the city contract with its parking enforcement contractor to monitor and require ticketing of illegally parked



vehicles on Surfside and Vanderbilt.

These are all "zero sum gains" for the city and should not be opposed.

<u>Illumination, aka "I Never Saw Him"</u>: The good part about being a teenager is that you think that you're indestructible. The bad part is that you're not.

One night recently, a teen came speeding down Croatan Road <u>on an e-bike</u> without visible lights or reflectors. I first saw him as he passed me. Whether on a bicycle or e-bike, forward and rear <u>lights are</u> required by <u>law</u> when riding before sunrise and after sunset. Pedestrians and golf cart users should also consider having lights for their safety.

From my Navy days, navigation lights should be illuminated whenever you're in reduced visibility – fog, precipitation, darkness, and especially twilight. "All lights, bright lights, Sir." Seeing and being seen could save your life, or the lives of loved ones. Think: Christmas gift?

Croatan Security Patrol Survey

Since we lost our dedicated patrol officer (MPO Don Noah) three years ago, his designated successor (MPO Katie Tassa) and three other officers have been fulfilling the security patrol duties here in Croatan.

In March 2024, VBPD changed their policies for how officers "moonlight" in off-duty jobs.

- Current guidance is that all contracted shifts must be a minimum of 3 hours in duration.
- VBPD and their contractor (Off-Duty Management) then added (unannounced) an additional half-hour to each end of every shift to account for travel time to and from patrol location.
- So, where Don Noah worked for \$35/hour and provided almost 400 hours to the community per annum, we are now faced with paying \$72.15/hour for only 249 hours.
- Because of the travel time assessment we've found ourselves paying for 25% more hours than we actually receive in on-location patrols.
- Accordingly, our annual budget has gone up 67% (to > \$22,000) for a 36% reduction of services.

This situation fails most objective business case analyses. However, an intangible/subjective sense of security within the community may lead some to desire continuance of these patrols.
