SAFETY & SECURITY

Protecting Property and Neighbors: For years, the homeowners at the easternmost end of Lake Christine have graciously allowed

pedestrians and bicyclists to use the cut-through between north and south Surfside Avenue that eases through their property. Riding **E-bikes** through this, often soggy, property, especially at more than a pedestrian's pace, damages the turf, the aesthetics, and the homeowner's right to peaceful enjoyment. It also endangers pedestrians and domestic/wild animals who share the same easement because sodden ground reduces a speeding rider's ability to stop or maneuver to avoid an accident.

These same issues exist on the Aqua Lane cut-through between Surfside and Vanderbilt, which, although public property, can be torn up by speeding E-bikes thereby creating a muddy environment through which no one wants to walk or bicycle.

Please respect public and private property and refrain from endangering others or infringing upon their right to the peaceful enjoyment of our community.

<u>**Croatan Parking Lot:**</u> Parking fees start on April 1 for those entering the Croatan parking lot after 10:00 AM. Virginia Beach residents are charged \$3.00, while non-residents are charged \$7.00. Pay at kiosks or by on-line apps. Lot closing time moves to 8:00 PM.

Motorcycle Season – **Look Twice**: Warming days bring two-wheelers out of hibernation to enjoy the clean air, natural beauty, and open spaces we've missed during winter. Riders – be sure to have your "ride" checked out with a spring tune-up and perform your pre-ride **T-CLOCS** inspection – **T**ires and Wheels, **C**ontrols, **L**ights and Electronics, **O**il and Fluids, **C**hassis, and **S**tand. Always burn your headlight, always wear your helmet, and anticipate your actions if/when drivers do the dumbest thing possible. Layer up – once the sun goes down, your speed becomes the wind-chill factor, have gloves, and both day and night goggles. Car drivers – please **look twice** for motorcyclists, especially when changing lanes and making turns, and give riders extra following distance. Most motorcyclists are responsible riders but there are outliers. Drivers - if a rider is traveling at high speed and weaving through traffic – let them go. Even passive aggressive behavior can lead to fatal consequences.
